Holy Week at All Saints'

Holy Week is the climax of our Lenten season, when we walk with Jesus from his triumphal entry into Jerusalem, to his Last Supper with his disciples, to the cross, and to his glorious resurrection on Easter morning. The drama of our faith comes to life in these special liturgies. Save the dates below, and join us to experience the mystery.

<u>Palm Sunday, April 13 at 9:00 a.m. and 11:15 a.m.</u> – Palm Sunday begins with an outdoor Liturgy of the Palms, when we read the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. As Jesus entered the Holy City on the back of a donkey, those standing by spread their garments and palms on the ground in awe and reverence. While the liturgy begins as a regal and triumphant celebration, everything changes with the dramatic reading of the Passion Gospel. The liturgy ends with a solemn procession.

Maundy Thursday, April 17 at 7:00 p.m. – "Maundy" comes from the Latin word "mandatum" which means "commandment." It recalls Christ's words at the Last Supper, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another." (John 3:34). We remember the Last Supper and Christ's gift to us of the institution of the Eucharist. After the Eucharist, the Sacrament is processed from the chapel to the Altar of Repose. After the real presence of Christ has been removed from the chapel, the service concludes by stripping the chancel bare.

Good Friday, April 18 at 12:00 p.m. – On Good Friday, we crucify our Lord. We pray ancient prayers called The Solemn Collects, read John's account of the Passion, and consume the Sacrament from the altar of the repose. In humble thanksgiving for Christ's work upon the cross, we venerate a bare wooden cross and pray, "Behold, the wood of the cross, whereon was hung the world's salvation." Join us immediately after for Children's Stations of the Cross, an interactive children's service for Good Friday. We talk about each event that leads up to Jesus's crucifixion in more detail, allowing the youth of All Saints' to learn about what happened through interactive stations.

The Great Easter Vigil, April 19 at 8:00 p.m. – In the Easter Vigil, we experience the resurrection together. The liturgy begins in the darkness as we light the Paschal candle from a new fire. We read the story of our salvation, beginning with our creation in the Garden of Eden and concluding with the Great Noise and a climactic proclamation of the Gospel. The service concludes with Holy Baptisms and the First Eucharist of Easter. This service features the All Saints' Brass Quintet and Timpani.

<u>Easter Morning</u>, <u>April 20 at 9:00 a.m. and 11:15 a.m.</u> – Easter morning is pure celebration! Sing your favorite Easter hymns, receive Holy Communion, and proclaim that the Lord is risen indeed! This service features the All Saints' Brass Quintet and Timpani.

Featured Vocalist's Concert



Expanding Our Feeding Ministry

In 2025, All Saints' has extended our reach to feed even more hungry folks in our city. We are now partnering with Meals on Wheels of Tarrant County to deliver hot meals to our neighbors in Fort Worth.

Meals on Wheels' mission is "to enable people to live with dignity and independence by offering community support through nutritious meals and MEALS on WHEELS coordinated services that improve well-being." Started in the early 1970s, Meals on Wheels of Tarrant County has grown from serving 25 meals their first day to approximately 1.3 million meals each year. Food insecurity is on the rise. The delivery of a hot

meal and a "How's it going?" goes a long way, particularly for senior citizens living alone. Meals on Wheels' clients' median age is 75.

All Saints' is delivering meals one day each week. We are currently looking for additional parishioners to help us deliver food. Whether you are available once a month, once a quarter, or even once a year, please consider taking up this ministry as a way to grow as a disciple of Jesus.
