
### **Honoring Dick Varnell**

For his many years of service to All Saints' Episcopal Church.

After 24 years of service to All Saints' Episcopal Church, **Dick Varnell** retired from his position as Treasurer at the 2025 Annual Parish Meeting. Our congregation applauded Dick on his decades of service, grateful for all he has done for our beloved parish.

Dick Varnell is a cradle Episcopalian, born in Casper, Wyoming. He and his family attended an Episcopal church there until he was 10, when his family moved to Midland, Texas. He attended Texas Tech and received a degree in Engineering, and the day following his graduation, he married his wife, **Emilie**.

For 60 years, Dick has worked for the Phillips Petroleum Company. He moved to Fort Worth in 1973, shuttling between Cowtown and Houston until settling permanently in Fort Worth in 1983. After attending a few other Episcopal churches, Dick attended a service at All Saints' near Thanksgiving. "I knew more people in the congregation here than I ever did in St. Andrews," he said in an interview. "So, I decided this is where I would stay." He joined All Saints' in 1996, and has been here ever since.

In 2000, Dick was appointed to the Vestry to take the place of an existing member who resigned. About a year later in 2001, Dick Varnell accepted the position of Treasurer here at All Saints. "I have an MBA, I'm a CPA, and I'm a registered professional engineer, so I was a jack of all trades," he explained as the reasoning behind his nomination. He worked with both Fr. Jambor and Lynn Waltman for 23 years, diligently keeping track of the church's finances. "Probably, I think I logged in over 350 vestry meetings in my period. I wanted to keep the financial statements, the integrity of them, beyond reproach." - *continued on Page 2*.

Dick did far more than just keep the parish's books and finances in order. He played a pivotal (many would say heroic) role in shepherding All Saints' through the dark days of schism and bankruptcy, helping the church retain its name, history, possessions and much of its property.

His dedication for his work in the church never waivered, even through the day-to-day tribulations we faced during the bankruptcy.

When asked what he felt was his greatest accomplishment, out of the many great accomplishments he achieved during his time as Treasurer, apart from funding the building of the Gray House, and funding a new HVAC system for the Gray House, Dick replied, "People trusted me. I was Treasurer for so long that I became kind of a symbol of the financial integrity of the church. And another achievement was being able to fund all the capital needs, which were significant, without a capital campaign."

"Like I said, I love this church and it's been a big part of my life. And I felt great about it. I never felt like I was a Bible scholar or a particular expert in scripture or anything like that."

"This was my way of serving the church that I loved, and I just can't tell you how strong I feel for it," he said with admiration.

Mthr. Hill honored Dick Varnell for his service at the Annual Parish Meeting with a memorial plaque in the form of a model ship, *The* Varnell, a symbol of Dick's skill in steering All Saints' in the right direction.

Words cannot express our admiration and thankfulness for Dick Varnell for his guidance, generosity, and dedication to our parish. We look forward to our All Saints' continued growth, following the steady course set by Dick Varnell.


### Spring Adult Forum: Unveiling the Mystery



### **Expanding Our Feeding Ministry**

In 2025, All Saints' has extended our reach to feed even more hungry folks in our city. We are now partnering with Meals on Wheels of Tarrant County to deliver hot meals to our neighbors in Fort Worth.

Meals on Wheels' mission is "to enable people to live with dignity and independence by offering community support through nutritious meals and coordinated services that improve well-being." Having started in the early 1970s, Meals on Wheels of



Tarrant County has grown from serving 25 meals their first day to approximately 1.3 million meals each year. Food insecurity is on the rise. The delivery of a hot meal and a "How's it going?" goes a long way, particularly for senior citizens living alone. Meals on Wheels' clients' median age is 75.

All Saints' is delivering meals one day each week. We are currently looking for additional parishioners to help us deliver food. Whether you are available once a month, once a quarter, or even once a year, please consider this ministry in the upcoming new year as a way to grow as a disciple of Jesus.



#### Brotherhood of All Saints'



### New School Leader Named, Follows Unprecedented 27-Year Tenure

After 27 years under the same leader, All Saints' Episcopal School will usher in its third Head of School effective July 1, 2025. The Board of Trustees has named current Assistant Head of School Wallace Worden as Dr. Tad Bird's successor. Dr. Bird will transition to Head of School Emeritus at that time.

"We are fortunate to be making this transition from a position of strength in programming and people," said Head of School Dr. Bird, "and I'm passing the baton to Wally with full confidence that All Saints' is remarkably well prepared for the future."



While the average tenure of a school leader is five years, All Saints' has had the great benefit of Head of School Tad Bird's visionary leadership for 27 years. In his tenure, Dr. Bird led the School through transformative measures that have elevated it from a small parish school to a premier Age 3-Grade 12 college preparatory institution. Notably, he:

- Fundraised for and oversaw the building of the current 147-acre gated campus in west Fort Worth that now serves 1,200+ students
- Reintroduced the Early Childhood program, building it from 38 students to 160 with a consistent waitpool
- Established mission-focused traditional curricular tenets through strategic partnership with the Lee & Ramona Bass Foundation
- Elevated all School fundraising to include a strong annual giving program and building the endowment from \$300k in 1998 to \$30M today
- Launched a landmark program for the most highly-motivated Upper School students the Tad Bird Honors College named after him as a nod to his vision and support

The evolution of student collegiate matriculations under his leadership is also highly notable: In addition to acceptances into a range of schools from Ivy League to in-state favorites, All Saints' senior classes on average earn \$13.8M in merit scholarships with 14+ student athletes signing to play in collegiate athletic programs (14%).

"Having worked for and with Dr. Bird for the past 25 years I've been able to learn from him firsthand," Wally Worden said. "And I'm excited to continue his vision and this great work."

The Board of Trustees focused on three primary areas in succession planning: Maintaining high standards and momentum, and appointing a person with strong character (visible, relatable and accessible) who also has a deep understanding of our School culture and community. As part of that discussion, Dr. Bird promoted Wally Worden from Upper School Division Head to Assistant Head of School in January 2023, to oversee the academic and admission teams, and eventually also the advancement team.

"All Saints' is in a unique position to capitalize on the stability of a homegrown candidate who has already proven to be invested in our community and successful at managing the day-to-day operations of the campus," said Rusty Reid, All Saints' Board of Trustees President. "If you know Wally, you know he is charismatic, energetic and solution-oriented." You can <u>read more here</u>.

This Head of School transition takes place at a pivotal moment in the School's history, as All Saints' will celebrate their 75th anniversary year starting this fall.


