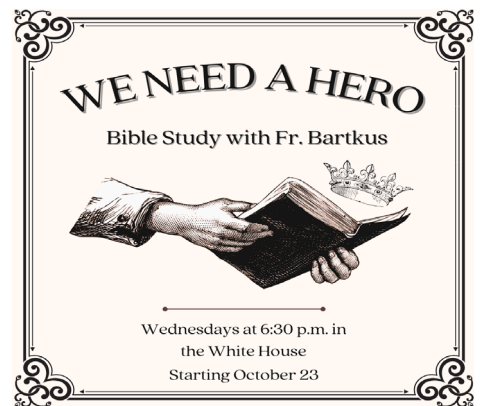

All Saints' Feeding Ministry - Upcoming Events

Many children in food-insecure families receive free breakfast and lunch during the week at school, but it can be a struggle for families to have enough to eat over the weekends. The All Saints' Feeding Ministry provides shelf-stable food to help bridge the gap.

This ministry serves hungry children around Fort Worth, including Como Community Center, Jo Kelly School, Glen Park Elementary, Bonnie Brae Elementary, Mary Louise, Phillips Elementary, and Boulevard Heights School. Additionally, we host bi-weekly food packing sessions with students from Boulevard Heights, providing them with valuable vocational skills they can carry into future jobs.

Anyone of any age, skill set, or experience is welcome to help us pack food during food packing sessions. Whether you are one year old or 100, there is a place for everyone in our Feeding Ministry!

Our next food packing session will take place on **Sunday, November 17 at 2:00 p.m.** at our Feeding Ministry Hub, 7616 Benbrook Parkway.

This year, All Saints' will deepen our partnership with the families we regularly serve in our Feeding Ministry by providing Thanksgiving staples and other meals for the holidays.

On **Sunday, November 24**, join us right after Solemn Evensong to help pack Thanksgiving staples and other meals for families in need at **5:30 p.m.** We will pack food in the Student Union, and afterwards, we will share a feast together.



Feeding Ministry Donations

Consider the All Saints' Feeding Ministry during your next trip to the grocery store to help support local kids in need. Currently, the Feeding Ministry is in need of donations to help support their weekly distribution of food.

Items needed for general food packing include the following: shelf-stable 1% white or chocolate milk, juice boxes, fruit snacks, fruit cups, applesauce, granola bars, mac and cheese cups, and crackers. Please drop off your donations in the baskets at the back of the All Saints' Episcopal School Chapel.

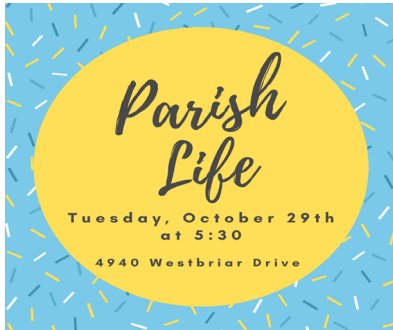
In addition to the usual donations, we are also in need of Thanksgiving staples and other food for our upcoming Thanksgiving food packing, including: 6-ounce boxes of stuffing mix, cans of corn, cans of cut green beans, 13.75-ounce boxes of instant mashed potatoes, 2-pound bags of rice, 2-pound bags of beans, 16-ounce boxes of spaghetti with sauce, and cake-mix boxes.

Donations can be dropped off in the back of the All Saints' School Chapel.

In addition to food donations, the Feeding Ministry is in need of volunteers to help not only pack food but also deliver food throughout the week to schools in need, typically weekdays during school hours.

Men's Fellowship Pizza & Travel Talk

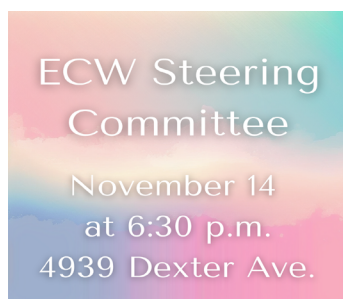

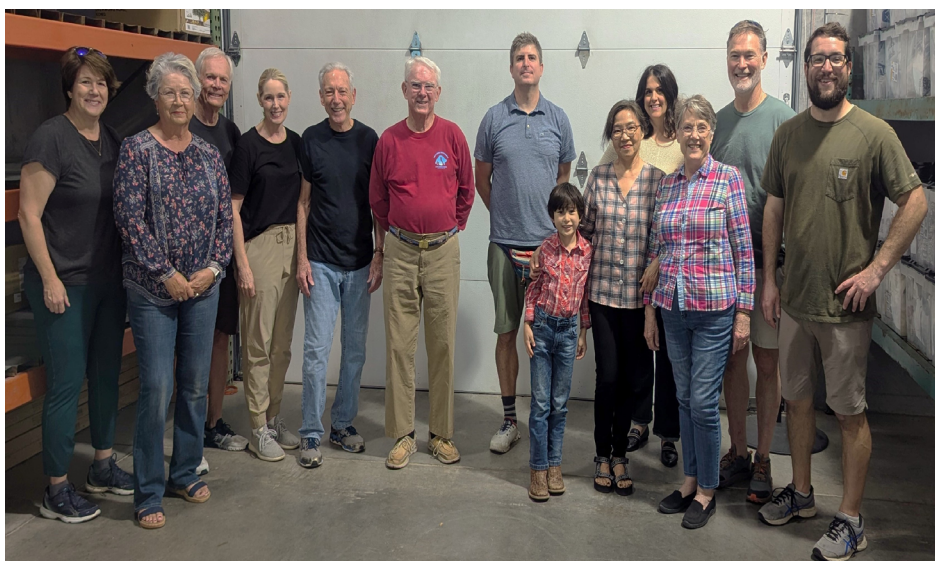
