We are The Episcopal Church in Ft. Worth.

We are trustees of The Episcopal Church.

We are Anglican – constituent members of the worldwide Anglican Communion in communion with the Archbishop of Canterbury. We are hierarchical, ancient, and global.

We are Catholic and Reformed/Protestant, a peculiar expression of English Catholicism.

We are the "middle way" – *via media* – not a compromise for the sake of peace but a comprehension for the sake of truth.

We are not a club, nor are we a party. We are a church, the Church catholic.

We have as our authority Scripture, Tradition, and Reason.

We pray what we believe. We believe what we pray. (Lex orandi, lex credendi)
