## About All Saints'

Established 1946

All Saints' began as a mission in 1946, and was elevated to a parish two years later. Since then, we have grown far beyond the dreams of our founders, establishing not only an early childhood - 12th grade college preparatory school, but also outreach partnerships in Kenya and Belize. Not all of our history has been easy. As a result of a schism with ACNA that began in 2008, we lost our beautiful, traditional building in 2021. Today, all of our litigation is concluded. We are financially sound and stronger than ever before. Throughout it all, we have never missed a beat in our call to serve God and his Church as the exemplar Episcopal parish in this region.

# About Our Outreach

## SEEKING AND SERVING CHRIST IN ALL PERSONS

Our work begins with a simple question: "How may I serve with you?"

- Feeding Ministry: Rolling up our sleeves, our volunteers purchase, pack, and distribute almost 30,000 meals for hungry children in Fort Worth every year.
- Adopt-a-Family: Each year our parishioners purchase, wrap, and deliver gifts to ensure that children in need across Fort Worth have a magical Christmas.
- Holy Cross Anglican School, Belize: We serve on the board of Holy Cross, which educates the poorest children in San Pedro. We also send missionaries to Belize regularly.
- Amazing Grace Children's Home and Schools, Kenya: We wholly support and educate the girls of Amazing Grace, who have been orphaned or abandoned. All Saints' steps in as their parents, supporting the girls through high school, university, or vocational school. The girls of Amazing Grace are integral members of our church family.





## Our Christian Education

We engage everyone in the life of our church. We especially treasure the spirituality of children, believing that they are the church today and tomorrow. Our Godly Play program is the oldest, continuously running in the world. Visitors have come to All Saints' from around the globe to learn Godly Play from our example. As our children grow, we prepare them not only for confirmation, but also help them build a resilient faith that will sustain them into adulthood. Adults enjoy well-attended Sunday forums and Wednesday Bible studies, all custom-built for us by our clergy.



## Our Day School

### ALL SAINTS' EPISCOPAL SCHOOL

What began as a preschool in our undercroft almost 75 years ago has grown into a college-preparatory school of 1,200 students on 147 acres. All Saints' really is an Episcopal School, with daily Morning Prayer and weekly Holy Eucharist - all according to the Book of Common Prayer. We take very seriously our role in the school's governance and mission.

# About Fort Worth

Fort Worth is the 12th largest U.S. city and among the fastest growing, offering a unique blend of world-class art institutions and performing arts, yet fully embracing its storied Western heritage. With an estimated 2024 population of 996,756, the city is served by 16 colleges and universities, 140 public schools in FWISD, and 73 private schools. Fort Worth has more than 300 public parks, and features an almost endless array of dining and entertainment options.



# Our Finances

In spite of our litigation, we have maintained a rock-solid financial foundation. Giving is strong. The average parishioner gives 6.53% of their income to All Saints', which puts our generosity in the 97th percentile. Most of our parishioners agree that All Saints' is their highest philanthropic priority. As we continue to grow, we are preparing for an expanded budget of \$1.3 million in 2025.
